Jason Nelson was adjudged bankrupt on 12 April 2024. As such, his 2023/2024 practising certificate was automatically suspended.

The suspension of Mr Nelson's practising certificate has been terminated subject to the following conditions.

- 1. Mr Nelson is not a manager or owner of any authorised body.
- 2. Mr Nelson may not practise on his own account under Regulation 10.2(a) or (b) of the SRA Authorisation of Individuals Regulations.

In these conditions the terms are as defined in the SRA Glossary.

#### Reasons/basis

The above conditions are necessary in the public interest. They are reasonable and proportionate having regard to the purposes set out in regulation 7 of the SRA Authorisation of Individuals Regulations, and the regulatory objectives and principles governing regulatory activities as contained in section 28 of the Legal Services Act 2007.
